Bureaucracy and the Principal-Agent Problem. The word bureaucracy is similar to the word "democracy," in that both words refer to kind of political power. Democracy is based on two Greek roots: "demos" for the people, and "kratos,"meaning rule or strength. Thus democracy means the rule or (interestingly) the strength of the people.

Democracy is the process whereby the government is elected by the people whereas Bureaucracy is the system which that elected government employs to run state matters through competent state officials selected by the government, not elected by the public, often through civil servants selected on the base of merit and intellectual capacity to implement the governments matters to translate public's interests into reality.

However, democracy is against bureaucracy or social order, since it tends to reduce everyone at the same level. This means that the two are conflicting, since bureaucracy strives to maintain a social order while democracy destroys this order by reducing everyone at the same level through equality (Larry, 1999).
